

He is the past president of the National Speakers Association Utah chapter and a member of the exclusive elite Speakers Roundtable (one of twenty of the world's top speakers).

As a member of the National Speakers Association, Chad travels as many as 300,000 miles a year captivating and entertaining audiences around the world. He had graced the stage of hundreds of professionals and civic organizations including Wells Fargo, Blue Cross Blue Shield, AT&T, Rainbird, IHC, American Express, Prudential Life, Vast FX, and Merrill Lynch.

Jeff Thompson is the Director of the Romney Institute of Public Management at Brigham Young University, where he teaches organizational behavior courses in the MPA program and business ethics courses in the MBA program. He holds a B.A. in Japanese, and an MBA from Brigham Young University. He earned his Ph.D. in organizational behavior, with an emphasis in ethics, at the University of Minnesota in 1999.

Dr. Thompson's research, published in top management journals, focuses on meaningful work and the pursuit of a professional "calling." His study on callings in the zookeeping profession was named best study of the year in the field of organizational behavior by three different academic associations. He also publishes research on organizational ethics. He is a frequent speaker on these topics.
