DESCRIPTION OF TOUR:

In the Fall of 2015, with the help of \$57,000 that was provided by the St. George City Council, SHAC began a remodel. The project was completed in July 2016. It has transformed the facility into 3 new areas, Pelican Pond, Kong's jungle and Tiki beach. The idea was to capture swimmers imagination as soon as they entered the lobby area, and carrying the theme throughout the entire facility. The design of the new jungle, island themed Aquatic Center was done in-house and the procurement of replacement water attractions was done by 2 resident full-timers, and 1 part-time staff.
